HELP PAYING FOR MEDICATIONS

PURCHASING MEDICATIONS FROM CERTIFIED CANADIAN PHARMACIES

- The price of medications in Canada is controlled by the government.
- Use only Canadian Pharmacies that are certified members of the Canadian International Pharmacy Association (CIPA). CIPA should be shown on their home page.
- Many medications can be purchased for a fraction of the cost you would pay in the US. For example, a widely used medication costing \$12 per pill in the US may be purchased from Canada for \$1.25 per pill. A savings of 90%.
- Medications purchased from a licensed Canadian pharmacy are the same as those purchased in the US.
- Medications are received blister packed in their original container.
- Medications can be purchased by phone or on-line.
- *A valid US prescription must be faxed to the Canadian pharmacy.*
- Medications deemed controlled substances in the US cannot be purchased from a licensed Canadian pharmacy.
- Prescriptions filled in the US are valid for 12 months from the day they are written.
- Prescriptions filled by a Canadian Pharmacy are valid for 24 months from the day they receive the prescription.
- If purchased from a Canadian Pharmacy you may purchase the total quantity of the original fill plus all refills. This provides for more cost savings and you are less likely to run out of your medications.
- You should receive your order via mail within 3 to 4 weeks.
